WHEREAS, Hodulik and Morrison, P.A. has served as Borough Auditor and proposes to continue to serve in this capacity for fees not to exceed in the aggregate \$26,750.00 for the following services: annual audit of the Borough (\$18,575.00); preparation of annual financial statement (\$4,450.00); preparation of annual debt statement (\$1,025.00); audit of the Pennington Library (\$2,700.00);

WHEREAS, Hodulik and Morrison shall perform such additional professional services as may be requested from time to time by the Borough at the following hourly rates: principal - \$160.00; senior accountant - \$140.00; junior accountant - \$125.00; and as further set forth in the attached letter of engagement dated December 28, 2019 provided aggregate fees under this contract, including expenses, shall not exceed \$26,750.00 without the prior written approval of Borough Council;

RESOLUTION FIXING THE RATE OF INTEREST AND YEAR-END PENALTY FOR DELINQUENT REAL ESTATE TAX PAYMENTS AND AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO EXTEND THE GRACE PERIOD FOR THE 3RD QUARTER TAX PAYMENTS FOR 2020 IF NECESSARY

WHEREAS, R.S. 54:4-67 permits the governing body of each municipality to fix the rate of interest to be charged for nonpayment of taxes or assessments on or before the date when they would become delinquent, subject to maximum rates provided by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Pennington, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, that property taxes shall be due and payable quarterly on February 1st, May 1st, August 1st, and November 1st of each year with a ten-day grace period, after which such taxes, if remaining unpaid, shall become delinquent and interest shall be charged thereon from the date the tax was first payable to the date of actual payment, at the following rates: eight percent (8%) per annum on the first \$1,500 of the delinquency and eighteen percent (18%) per annum on any amount in excess of \$1,500.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that payments on delinquent accounts shall be credited first to the first \$1,500 of the delinquency and then to the balance of the delinquency, and once the first \$1,500 of the delinquency has been paid, the interest rate shall be eighteen percent (18%) on the balance of the delinquency regardless of the amount of such balance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a year-end penalty of six percent (6%) shall be assessed on the last day of the fiscal year on the full amount of delinquent accounts with delinquencies in excess of \$10,000.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Pennington Borough Council hereby authorizes the Tax Collector to extend the grace period for third quarter 2020 tax payments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tax Collector shall determine the extension period upon receipt of the 2020 Final Tax Bills and said period shall not exceed 30 days beyond the mailing date of the bills to taxpayers.

WHEREAS, this appointment also complies with the Code of the Borough of Pennington, Section 15-1, et seq., prohibiting the award of public contracts to certain political contributors;

WHEREAS, this contract is being awarded as a professional services contract in compliance with the Local Public Contracts Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-1, <u>et seq.</u>, and is not required to be subject to advertising for proposals or competitive bidding because the services contracted for are of such a qualitative nature as will not reasonably permit the drawing of specifications or the receipt of competitive bids;

WHEREAS, the Mayor nominates as Borough Engineer Norman Nelson of Van Note Harvey Associates, a licensed professional engineer of the State of New Jersey, subject to advise and consent of Council and agreement on a final contract for professional services with Mr. Nelson and his firm Van Note Harvey Associates;

WHEREAS, Norman Nelson and Van Note Harvey Associates has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that the firm has made no reportable contribution to a political or candidate committee in the Borough of Pennington and shall not make any such contribution through the term of the contract;

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough has certified that funds are available for the purpose of this contract in the Engineering Current Fund and Water Sewer Operating Funds (0-01-20-165-000-262 and 0-05-55-501-000-262 and 0-05-55-502-000-262);

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contracts Law requires that a resolution authorizing an award of contract for professional services without competitive bid be publicly advertised following adoption;

WHEREAS, at the time of adoption of this Resolution the parties have yet to agree upon the terms of a final contract and list of approved projects;
