COMMUNITY CATS IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD?

What you need to know:



• Community cats (also known as feral, outdoor, stray or barn cats) are unowned cats who live outdoors. Community cats are the same species as domestic animals (Felis Catus), but were not socialized to humans and not generally adoptable.



Studies show outdoor cats are as healthy as pet cats and can have the same life span. Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) or Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return is a humane and effective way of keeping community cats healthy and limiting their population.



Hopewell Township Animal Control is NOT needed for well-managed, healthy community cat colonies (groups of community cats). There are numerous organizations that residents can contact for more information and for help with TNR*.
